 - Keira has a student in our school and will be on School Community Council for the remainder of this school year.

3. Follow-Up From Last Months Meeting (Jentry Youd)

- Parents should be receiving a weekly email about their students' grades and attendance. This is a new system from the District.
- Crosswalk on Center Street: Spanish Fork City ran tests and gathered data on our crosswalk which showed 100% compliance. The data also shows that approximately 50 students use the crosswalk daily. Spanish Fork City purchased 8 more cones to be used for the cross walk to help traffic slow down in the school zone. Spanish Fork City as well as UDOT will propose that our school walking route change next year when a traffic light is installed at 800 east and Center

Street.

4. Technology Use and Digital Citizenship (Jentry Youd)

- LAN School
- Eric Evans informed the council about LAN School and how it is used in classrooms. LAN School is a program where the classroom teacher can see every student's chromebook screen and the work they are doing during classtime to insure that students are on task.
- NetSmartz Assembly (September 29, 2022)
- The NetSmartz Assembly was presented to all 6th graders in September. It covers how to be safe and what the danger are when being on the internet, social media, and gaming systems.
- Internet filtering and how it works
- Nebo School District does have an Internet Filtering System. When students are logged into their Nebo Gmail accounts, the filtering system tracks what students are searching and viewing. When the students ID is flagged through the filter, School Administrators are informed and then they contact the student's parents.

5. Comprehensive Guidance Committee (Mike McKell)

- Counselors: What do School Counselors do for students to help with student academics, well being, and future career paths?
- A few of the Counselor tasks at school are: registration, course selection, youth support for struggling students, student academics, club or after school activities, teaching inclass lessons on student success, mental health counseling, organizing spirit weeks, holding friendship groups, PCCR meetings with 7th graders, and a yearly state data project to show student growth.
