

# Math 7

## Class Rules:

1. No food, drink, or electronic devices (IPOD, cell phone, games, etc.) that can damage the classroom or interrupt class will be allowed.
2. Bring all necessary classroom materials (workbook, pencil, correcting pen, paper).

## **ASSESSMENTS: 70%**

### **Assessment Mastery:**

1. During any test there is a no talking policy. Any talking during an assessment can be interpreted as cheating.
2. Cheating is not tolerated! If caught cheating a zero will be given on the assessment.
3. Students may retake assessments as needed, but limited to one retake per chapter assessment.

### **Quiz Mastery:**

1. Quizzes will be given frequently throughout the year.
2. Each quiz will assess a student's knowledge of a math concept or idea.
3. Quizzes will be retaken if the concept or idea is not mastered. Students are responsible for the retake.
4. Any quiz not taken will show up as missing until completed.

## **ASSIGNMENTS: 30%** (Parents, please help your child be successful by making sure homework is completed).

1. Write your name, homework assignment, and period number on every assignment.
2. **SHOW YOUR WORK!** With the new Math Core, students are expected to do more writing, justifying, or providing steps in solving a problem. Showing work is essential and will be part of grading assignments. Research has shown those who show work understand and retain information better than those who don't. When calculators are used, write on your paper what was typed on the calculator. Homework with just answers will be redone before receiving credit.
3. Late work will be worth 80% and may be turned in until a specified day at the end of the term. Late assignments will only be accepted if they are completely finished and work is shown.
4. Absent work will be given full credit. Please hand in absent work within a reasonable amount of time, usually before the end of chapter/unit test. If you know you will be absent please get the assignment you will be missing before you go. **Students will be responsible to find out what he/she has missed.**
5. If the assignment isn't finished in class it is to be finished at home, then brought back to be graded the next school day.
6. Each student will be required to work on a new math program adopted by the school, called Derivita, for at least 30 minutes each week. Derivita lessons will be posted on Canvas.

### **Extra Credit:**

1. Points will be given weekly if all homework for that week is finished and turned in on time. These points will be added toward homework scores.
2. Progress reports will be given out at mid-term and end of term, and will be extra credit on assessment scores if it is signed by a parent or guardian and turned in by a specified day.
