




POLICIES:

PROFICIENCY IS THE GOAL

All four modalities: We listen, read, write, and speak in Spanish.

Language and culture: We use the language to explore our cultures, Spanishspeaking cultures, world cultures, and ancient cultures.

Real world preparation: We use useful language in the class so that we are prepared to communicate in the real world.

Student centered: We center our interactions on what each student needs, knows, and can do <u>now</u> and what each student needs in order to move forward.
