

Student Dress and Grooming Standards

Nebo School District Policy JDG - Student Dress and Grooming Standards says that student dress and grooming should not interfere with the normal educational environment at school or at a school activity or event.

The policy created by the Nebo School District School Board is summarized on the following slides.

Student Dress and Grooming Standards (cont.)

We all have clothing that may be appropriate to wear at home with our friends and family, but not to school.

Student Dress and Grooming Standards (cont.)

Most jobs have an expectation for what you wear, even if it's more casual. All of the employees in our building follow dress and grooming standards, even though their job duties might call for different types of dress.

Student Dress and Grooming Standards (cont.)

- 1. Think for a minute about what people are required to wear in different professions either for appearance, safety, or practicality. There are many reasons a profession has dress and grooming standards.**
- 2. With your neighbor, discuss one school-appropriate profession that has some sort of dress expectations.**
- 3. Share out as a class.**

Student Dress and Grooming Standards (cont.)

It's okay to follow dress expectations in a particular situation, even if they aren't your favorite! We know it can be tricky to get up on time for school and find something to wear. We appreciate that you **DO** so often follow the policy!

Student Dress and Grooming Standards (cont.)

Here are our basics:

- Shorts and skirts must be mid-thigh length or longer when seated.

(Helpful hint: shorts and skirts get shorter when you sit down, and sometimes that's what makes them not fit the policy.)

Here are our basics:

- Clothing should cover shoulders, chest, stomach, and back.

- Rips and holes in jeans must be below mid-thigh.

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Student Dress and Grooming Standards (cont.)

- Hair should be well-groomed and styled in a way that does not cause a distraction.



FUN FOR HOME, BUT NOT FOLLOWING POLICY FOR SCHOOL



- Sunglasses may **NOT** be worn in the building.

Student Dress and Grooming Standards (cont.)

- Hats and hoodies **MAY** be worn so long as they do not hide your face. If a teacher requests that you remove your hood while in a classroom, please do so.



Student Dress and Grooming Standards (cont.)

- No clothing, hats, masks, accessories that
 - > signify gang affiliation
 - > have obscene or suggestive words/images
 - > represent illegal substances
(Remember: If you can't legally possess the item, you can't wear it on your clothing, either.)

Student Dress and Grooming Standards (cont.)

- Students may not wrap up in extra items (e.g. blankets, flags, other items that create safety or distraction concerns) during the day.
- Appropriate footwear must be worn all day. Students in PE classes must wear shoes that allow them to participate in activities.

If you are wearing items at school that do not comply with the district policy, you will be referred to the office to discuss how you can fix the situation.
