School Rules



Every student has the right to feel safe in their school and classroom. I expect all students to follow the rules of the school in my classroom. Course Components



The intent of this class is to address the individual reading needs of all students. We will include individualized reading instruction with progress monitoring to develop word attack, word recognition, and oral fluency skills; group reading and discussion to develop comprehension skills; and learning of text reading and written test-taking strategies. There will be periods of discrete, teacher-led instruction and periods of independent reading and practice. Students should realize that their focus and effort during these independent periods will largely contribute to the progress they make.

In order to develop more effective decoding skills (word recognition and attack), we will be using the Wilson Reading System. For strengthening comprehension, students will be assigned text passages from a variety of reading programs (including Reading A-Z, CommonLit, ReadWorks) and leveled reading materials. We will also incorporate plenty of class discussion, supplemental enrichment activities (small projects, games, etc), and independent reading time to ensure a varied and well-rounded approach to reading improvement.

Be the best "you" you can be, and do the best work you can do. Learn all you can!

When you arrive to class	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ LOOK ON THE BOARD FOR INSTRUCTIONS! ⇒ Sharpen pencils (if needed) and get out needed supplies.
When the bell rings	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Be in your assigned seat – CLASS HAS STARTED ! ⇒ Begin bellwork or report to instruction table!
When Mrs. Wanlass is teaching	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Pencils, pens, markers down and eyes up front. ⇒ Sit up in your desk – don't put your head on your desk. ⇒ LISTEN/RESPOND – no talking/writing notes/drawing pictures/etc unless so directed.
When your classmates are talking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ LISTEN – no talking/writing notes/drawing pictures/etc. ⇒ No rude comments.
If you have a question or comment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Wait for the appropriate time to raise your hand. ⇒ Wait to be called on.
When working on the white boards/ chromebooks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Do not doodle and goof around. ⇒ Work on the reading or other work that you have been assigned.
When given an assignment/direction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Begin working on/following it immediately. ⇒ If you have questions, ask Mrs. Wanlass. ⇒ Do your BEST work in your BEST handwriting.
If you are absent	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Check Google Classroom. ⇒ See Mrs. Wanlass for missed assignment makeup. Complete and turn in your assignments promptly.
If you need a hall/bathroom pass	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Ask permission by raising your hand (with index finger extended if for the bathroom). ⇒ Let Mrs. Wanlass know if there is a medical condition that necessitates more frequent/longer than normal bathroom use.
When announcements come on	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Do not talk. ⇒ Listen to what is being announced.
If you need help while working	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Keep trying or move on while you wait for Mrs. Wanlass to come to you. ⇒ If you need help immediately, raise your hand in a circle.
If you get frustrated or “don't feel like it”	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Try not to have a meltdown and don't whine..... PLEASE ☺ !! ⇒ We can work through it together.... I am here to help!!! ⇒ Think positive thoughts 🌟 !!!
